

General election and HNC mock election

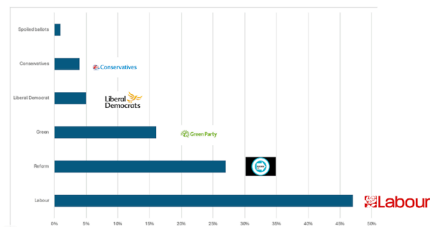
Thank you to all students who cast their vote at the HNC mock election last week - the results of which can be found below.

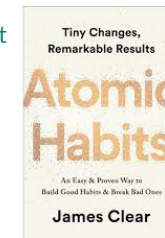
Happy summer
